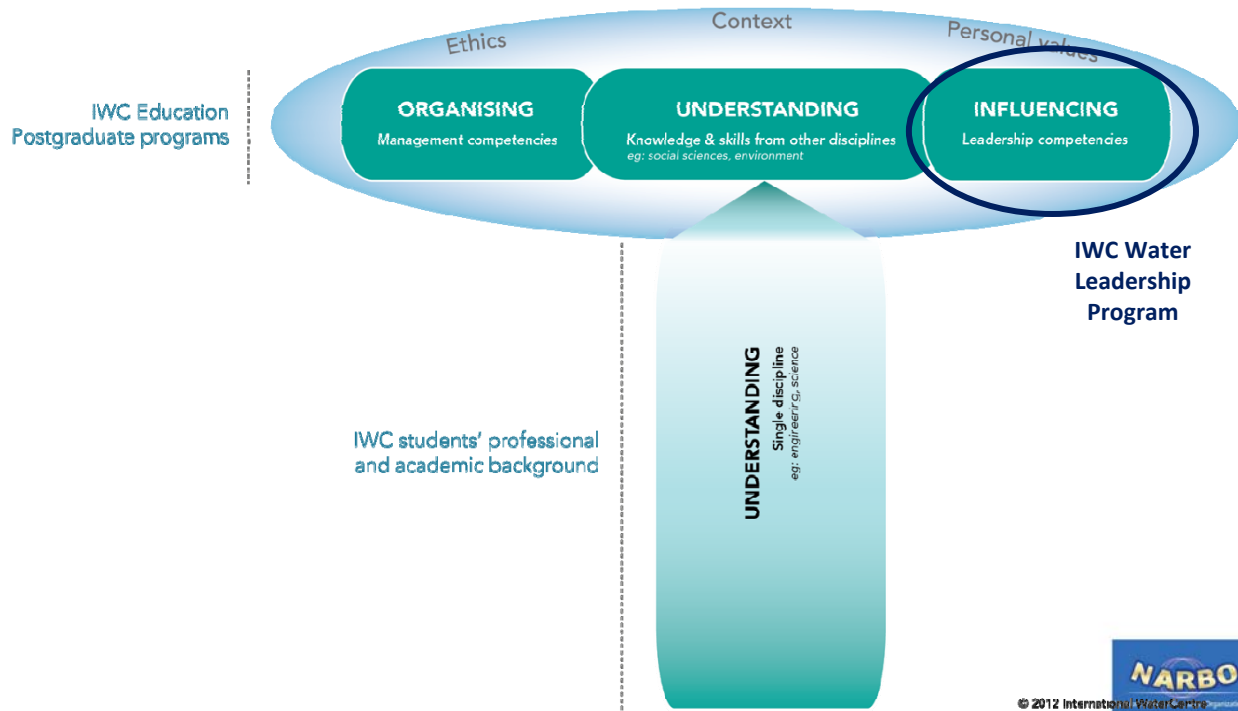

- Funded by Australian Government through the Australian Award Fellowship Program



Australian Government
AusAID



- Group 1 approved – commences February 2014
- 2 week in Australia + distance learning / return to work activities
- 5 countries, 10 fellows
- In conjunction with Australian emerging water leaders



IWC – NARBO

Water Leadership Program #2

- IWC inviting NARBO members to nominate fellows for 2 week Water Leadership Program in late 2014.
- Competitive grants (not guaranteed)
- Maximum 20 fellows
- Target emerging water leaders with 5-15 years work experience in IWRM or related discipline



Target audiences

- Team / project leader – formally responsible for delivering outcomes, need to build, manage and monitor project delivery and build and communicate shared visions
- Project champion – initiate and drive processes of change, highly motivated, excel at exerting influence
- Enabling water leader - people who enable others to find solutions to complex water management problems, create environments for others to interact and collaborate



Requirements

- Letter of approval by senior official of organisation
- CV in approved template
- In kind contribution (salary, support to share knowledge, visa costs)
- Government & civil society
- Seeking gender balance
- By 30 May, 2013



What is included

- 1 week Water Leadership Short Course (Brisbane) to develop leadership skills and behaviours (not technical water management training)
 - self awareness (giving and receiving feedback)
 - creating a shared vision
 - leading by example
 - developing collaborative networks
 - communication & listening
 - systems thinking
 - influencing & motivating



What is included

- 1 week study tour to Canberra / Melbourne
 - Government roundtable
 - Workshops on IWRM, water reform and leadership etc.
- Return to home
 - On line course work
 - Professional development plan
 - Coaching sessions
- AusAID / IWC covers
 - All international travel, accommodation and living \$\$
 - Domestic travel in Australia
 - Program course costs
