

### Issues presented:

Lack of a common policy for the management and development of the lake and its resources

Most plans/programs of different stakeholders are not anchored on the Laguna de Bay master Plan

Debate on the wisdom, size, location and benefits of the Zoning and Management Plan (ZOMAP)

Coverage of water rights in LDB is limited to fishery.

LLDA lacks continuing control over all programs and projects affecting the lake and its region.

LLDA has a wide jurisdictional mandate but it has limited staff to effectively carry out its mandates.

# Selection of one primary issue

The need to formulate and implement a policy on the use of surface water because Laguna de Bay Region is slowly reaching a state where the quantity and quality of freshwater resources are imposing limits on the present use of the resource and on the region's socio-economic development
