


What are the activities of the Youth Initiative?

What are the activities of the Youth Initiative?




- Improves institutional capacity to share knowledge and collaborate productively with AYP's

- Delivers tools and knowledge products, resources, guidance, and training to ADB staff, ADB stakeholders and the youth of Asia







Conclusions and Recommendations

Proposal: Youth River Councils

- Main Goal: Strengthen youth participation in river management by building capacity and providing knowledge and support



Proposal: Youth River Councils

- Composed of representatives of youth organizations located in an area where a River Council is operating
- Will implement programs promoting key dimensions of water security, and support RC plans
- Are integrated into River Councils and have a seat in planning and decision-making

Proposal: Youth River Councils

Output	Indicators	Achievement Date
River youth councils are created	Each target has one RYC 5 action plans >75% implementation of activities	April 2015
Youth participation is institutionalized	>1 policy/partnership established	August 2015
Toolkit is developed	One toolkit is disseminated 20 trainers trained	August 2015
River youth councils are operational	Seed fund established to finance 5 RYC projects	September 2015

How would YRCs improve Youth Participation in IWRM?

- 1. Communication and Collaboration among Youth
 - -Better communication and coordination among youth
 - -Easier mobilization of youth
 - -Sharing of best practices and strategies
 - -Added incentive for other youth in decision making and planning
- 2. Representation of Youth in Decision-Making and Planning
 - -Access to information, resources and networks to strengthen existing youth initiatives
- Complement RC decisions and provide necessary resources
