The report about the Third South Asia Water Forum

The Third South Asia Water Forum was held from July 13 to 15 for three days at Pan Pacific Sonargaon Hotel in Dhaka, Bangladesh with more than 250 participants. This Water Forum was sponsored by Global Water partnership-South Asia, Japan Water Forum and United Nations Development Program (UNDP).

The Forum consisted of the inaugural session, technical session, plenary session and concluding session. Twelve technical sessions covered not only water-related issues but also IWRM-related issues such as "IWRM: Practices and Legal Framework/Institution" and "River Basin Organization/Area Water Partnership" etc. From NARBO Secretariat, Mr. TAKAGI (JWA: Japan Water Agency) attended the forum and made a keynote speech titled "What's NARBO-Process to its establishment and goal-" at "River Basin Organization/Area Water Partnership" session on July 14. He distributed NARBO newsletters and advertised NARBO. During the forum, some of the participants asked him what to do to become its member. It

seems the name of NARBO is gradually getting known among RBOs and other related organizations.

On the final day, July 15 at the closing session, the Dhaka Declaration was presented and adopted. The declaration emphasized the importance of basin-wide planning and management approach.

Although Bangladesh was hit by flood, the forum ended successfully with the good arrangement by the forum secretariat.

Recommendations from SAWAF-III

The Third South Asia Water Forum (SAWAF-III) was held in Dhaka from July13-15, 2004 with over 250 delegates and participants coming from the South Asia (Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Maldives, Nepal, Pakistan, and Sri Lanka) as well as from other countries like Japan, U.S.A, U.K, Australia, Malaysia and the Netherlands. Besides the Inaugural Session and the Closing Session, the Forum was conducted through 12 Technical sessions and 2 plenary sessions. In these sessions a total of 75 technical paper, 5 Keynote papers, 7 country papers and 15 speeches were delivered. Originally the main theme of the Forum was "Flood Management". But subsequently it was decided to expand the theme to accommodate much needed discussion on Integrated Water Resources Management (IWRM), Millennium Development Goals (MDG) and WSSD Action Plan. Technical sessions were held on the following themes:

- Flood, Climate change and Disaster Management,
- Water, Food, Agriculture and Environment,
- Water, Governance and financing,
- Water, Poverty and Livelihoods,
- Water and Energy,
- WSSD Targets and MDGs
- IWRM: Practices and Legal Framework and Institutions
- Water for Peace and Transboundary Water Issues,
- Water Supply and Sanitation, and
- River Basin Organizations and Area Water Partnerships

A pre-Forum workshop was held on 'Reuse of waste water and City effluents for Agriculture Aquaculture and eco sanitation'. Another pre-Forum activity was the meeting of the 'Women for Water Network-South Asia'.

Recommendations of the Forum:

- Noting the importance of the following water related themes and associated targets emanating from the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) and WSSD Action Plan, the Forum called for urgent actions by all countries of the region for achieving them:
 - The target of development of Integrated Water Resources Management and water efficiency plans, by 2005.
 - The target to half the proportion of people who do not have access to safe drinking water and basic sanitation, by 2015, and,
 - The target to halve the proportion of the population who are below poverty line and the proportion of people who suffer from hunger, by 2015.
- Being aware of the challenges being faced by the region due to population growth, food shortage and the need to increase food production to meet the increasing demand, the Forum endorsed the call for "more crop with less drop" of water and for improvement of water use efficiency. The Forum then cautioned all concerned to pay due attention to maintain the quality of environment and protection of nature.
- Taking note that incorrect figures related availability of water resources is in circulation, the Forum calls for correct assessment of surface water as well ground water resources for all basins, for incorporation in future plans.
- Being aware that coastal zones need to be considered as an integral part of freshwater management the Forum suggests that integration of the concept of ICZM and IWRM be facilitated.
- The Forum recommends that for supply of various services the countries need not look at market mechanism alone but also pay attention to social values as well historical and cultural practices while preparing IWRM Plan.

- The Forum is of the opinion that 'institutional arrangement' is essential element of IWRM. Towards this, voice of grass-root level stakeholders is appropriately incorporated in all future planning and operation of water management projects.
- Recognizing the importance of governance in water management the Forum recommends that civil society be given monitoring role to ensure accountability and transparency.
- the Forum calls for effective incorporation of gender considerations in IWRM plans.
- The forum advocates that public participation, reference to traditional methods of managing water in developing appropriate technologies, and environmental considerations lead to sustainable livelihood that that have long term effects on reducing poverty.
- The forum notes with concern that there is a strong nexus among floods, droughts and poverty, and recommends that steps be taken to map the critical areas for preparation of appropriate strategies to address the concerns.
- Recognizing that there are spaces both for private sector and public sector the Forum calls for effective private and public sector partnership within the IWRM framework.
- Recognizing the inseparable links between sound sanitation services and safe supply of drinking water, the Forum recommended mobilization of additional financial resources for water supply and sanitation programmes.
- Being concerned with the increasing incidence and severity of water related disasters, the Forum suggests that the governments in partnership with other stakeholders give special attention to preparation for flood and drought management plans in the context of national IWRM Plans, NAPAs and PRSPs etc. The Forum alerted all concerned about the implication of climate change and climate variability that the world will be facing with higher level of impacts in coming years.
- Appreciating that in addition to structures, an increasing ensemble of non-structural options are becoming available for the water sector that include forecasting information, early warning systems, and spatial planning and decision support systems, the Forum called for increasing and effective use of these instruments and exchange information on a regional basins in river basins in particular for the downstream populations.
- Being aware that the region is plagued with the problem of either too much water or too little water at different times of a year, the Forum urges for identification of critical areas for prioritized formation of AWPs and preparation of IWRM Plans that incorporates effective role for stakeholders at the grass-root level.
- The Forum notes that cost effective technologies are available for rainwater harvesting as well as for re-use of city effluents for agriculture, aquaculture, and eco-sanitation and these technologies be promoted all over the region.
- The Forum calls for support local level planning and management of water supply and sanitation interventions involving all stakeholders including government, NGOs, civil society, and the private sector.
- The Forum concluded that basin-wide planning and management approach should be effectively pursued in the Region. South Asia Regional Water Partnership (SA-RWP) may offer it's services as a facilitator for fostering regional co-operation for river basin management and resolving issues that go beyond the IWRM National Plans of the countries. To provide institutional support in achieving this objective, SA-RWP is urged to form committees, comprising of members from countries concerned, and River Basin Organizations (RBO), and Area Water Partnerships (AWP). It may be noted that confidence-building measures within the IWRM framework will be an important activity of the AWPs. The Forum recommends that the SA-RWP would take immediate steps to form the Ganges River Basin Organization (GRBO).

FINALLY,

The Forum calls for action so that water should not be a force of discord, rather are converted to a catalyst for amity, peace and prosperity.
