Participants are to be the "Core Member" of the thematic workshop on water allocation and water rights. **Also, participation is by invitation only**.

## 1. Background

## 1.1 Concept of the thematic workshop

NARBO has held the thematic workshop as the new attempt since 2005, which has the following features.

- Pragmatic and practical viewpoints are emphasized.
   NARBO mainly consists of water related government agencies and river basin organizations, which are in charge of practical water resources management. Thus, it is desirable to hold the activities that can contribute to the practitioners of water-related organizations. Therefore, pragmatic and practical viewpoint is very important.
- Deep and continuous discussions are intended. Firstly, in order to achieve an effect of the workshop, two-way communications are strongly recommended. For that purpose, we emphasize the discussions among the participants rather than typical workshop programs such as special lectures. In addition, it is necessary to discuss water-related issues continuously with spending sufficient time because they are often very complex. Therefore, the number of the thematic workshop will be several times against one theme, more than once, in order for the continuous discussion.
- Focused, specific and important themes related to IWRM are taken up.
   In order to make discussions deeply, focused and specific themes are desirable, which also should be important ones in implementing IWRM.
- Small scale and simple style are preferable.
  In order to make discussions deeply, it is desirable that the scale of the workshop should be small. Therefore, the number of participants per one country will be planned to be limited. Also, we intend to hold as many activities as possible though the financial resources of NARBO secretariat are quite limited. Therefore, the cost per one workshop should be reasonable.

The objectives of the thematic workshop are; (i) sharing information on current status of participating countries, (ii) clarifying the problems in participating countries, and (iii) approaching the way for improvement in cooperation with participants. Also, the number of the thematic workshop will be several times against one theme, more than once, in order for the continuous discussion.

With regard to the thematic workshop, we attach great importance to the self-reliant effort for problem solving made by participating countries themselves. In other words, we have to adopt the methods that participants themselves come up with the way for approaching improvement in line with each participant's country's situation. Due to that, participants are strongly recommended not only to make efforts on the workshops but during the interim period between each workshop to make internal discussions. Additionally, workshop outcomes, which will be prepared by participants themselves, are greatly expected to lead to the action plans for water resources management in each participating country.

## 1.2 Thematic workshop on water allocation and water rights

According to the outcome of the research in 2004, NARBO secretariat recognized that the NARBO members had had keen interest in the issues on water allocation and water rights. Thus, the issues on water allocation and water rights were taken up as the theme of the 1<sup>st</sup> thematic workshop. This workshop will be planned to be held a total of 4 times in two years, and the expected outcome of each workshop is as follows.

- 1<sup>st</sup>- To identify the issues in participating countries
- 2<sup>nd</sup>- To analyze the causes of the issues and suggest the approach to improvement
- 3<sup>rd</sup>- To review the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> workshop and suggest the approach to improvement
- 4<sup>th</sup>- To draft the report to make a suggestion

#### 1.3 About 4th workshop

The 4th workshop is the final one of this series, in which we will mainly focus on the presentation of **final action program for approach to improvement of water allocation issues** by each participant. In addition, we plan to hold field trips and some lectures. This time, the Japan Water Agency (JWA) takes the role of the host organization with NARBO secretariat.

## **Transportation**

## **Training Fees**

For implementation of this activity, the following expenditures to NARBO members, especially for Government organization and RBO members from oversea can be supported from NARBO secretariat and resource organizations in case participants from Southeast and South Asia hope. The self-financing by participants is highly expected.

- 1) Airfare of international flight for participants from oversea (Between Narita Airport and the nearest international airport of participants), if participant needs them,
- 2) Accommodation fee (actual cost) and per diem (2,400 JPY per day) if he/she needs them,
- 3) Airport transportation (5,500 JPY (round-trip)), internal transportation (actual cost) and miscellaneous expenses (\$40), if he/she needs it.

(Note: The above fees on airport transportation and per diem are special cases in expensive countries.)

### **Chilly Weather in Japan**

The NARBO workshop will be held in January in Japan and January is in the middle of the

winter season in Japan. Normally, the climate in Saitama City, the venue of the workshop in the JWA's headquarters, is very cold and dry with an average temperature at 3.7 degree Celsius and an average rainfall of 26mm. Please make sure that all participants bring warm jaketets, scarfs, gloves and others that will keep you warm as well as medicines and throat candy to prevent a cold .
