Training Components

The eight-day training will include:

- presentations from internationally recognised experts in IWRM and associated issues (e.g. community engagement, institutional and governance arrangements, biodiversity, water resources planning, flooding, water quality monitoring, reporting) from throughout Asia,
- two full-day field study visits of the Vu Gia-Thu Bon River Basin supported by local IWRM practitioners (this river basin case study is central to the training as it embodies many of the issues found in river basin management throughout Asia),
- small and whole group discussions of the materials presented (together with lessons from the field study visits, these will allow participants to test and build their understanding of the keys for success with IWRM),
- participants' presentations and a poster session (these will further cement participants' understanding of IWRM, and allow them to look at how these new insights will impact on their own practice of IWRM).

Certificates of Attendance and Exemplary Completion

All participants will receive a Certificate of Attendance. A Certificate of Exemplary Completion will be awarded to those participants who have excelled in achieving the learning objectives (www.narbo.jp/narbo/event/ev_annc_tc05.htm) set out for the training.

Each participant will be assessed using a variety of methods, including individual and group assignments throughout the training.

Expected Outcomes

After completion of the training, participants are expected to expand their professional network, become part of an ongoing network of IWRM practitioners focused on improving integrated water resource management in the river basins under their care, and be made aware of further training and professional development opportunities. Participants are expected to leave the training equipped with a kit of practical tools that will help them to improve their practice of integrated water resources management.

All participants will receive a CD copy of all technical papers and powerpoint presentations.

Financial Support for Participants

In accordance with its guidelines, NARBO can provide financial support to qualified participants from RBO and government member organizations, as follows:

- 1. Return international airfare (most direct and economical route from country of origin to airport of destination)
- Incidental costs at a lump sum of US\$40 (to help to cover airport taxes, airport transfers, and visa fees)
- 3. Accommodation charges up to US\$60 per night
- 4. Daily subsistence allowance up toUS\$15
- 5. Local transportation costs related to field study visits

Self-financing is highly welcomed and encouraged.

Registration Fee

As a matter of policy, NARBO charges a registration fee to partly cover the cost of the training program, as follows:

NARBO member organizations – \$200 USD per participant Non-NARBO member organizations – \$500 USD per participant

The fee can be paid in cash to the host organization upon registration.


